INTRODUCTION

OBJECTIVES OF DISSEMINATION & ADVOCACY

- Provide training, guidelines, and practical toolkits to encourage organizations to make their services, spaces, and communications more inclusive.

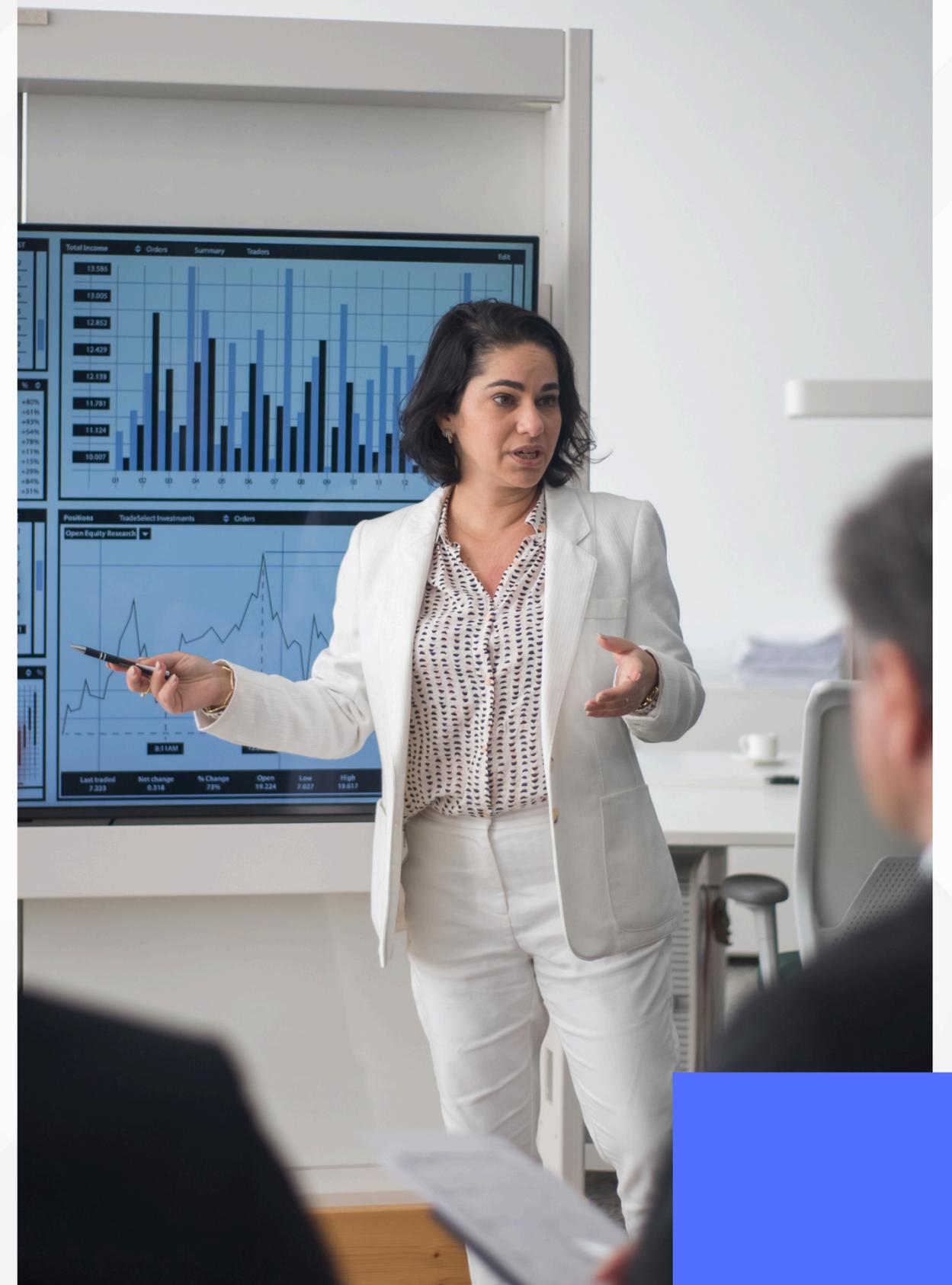


4. Encourage societal engagement in barrier-free mobility and inclusive planning

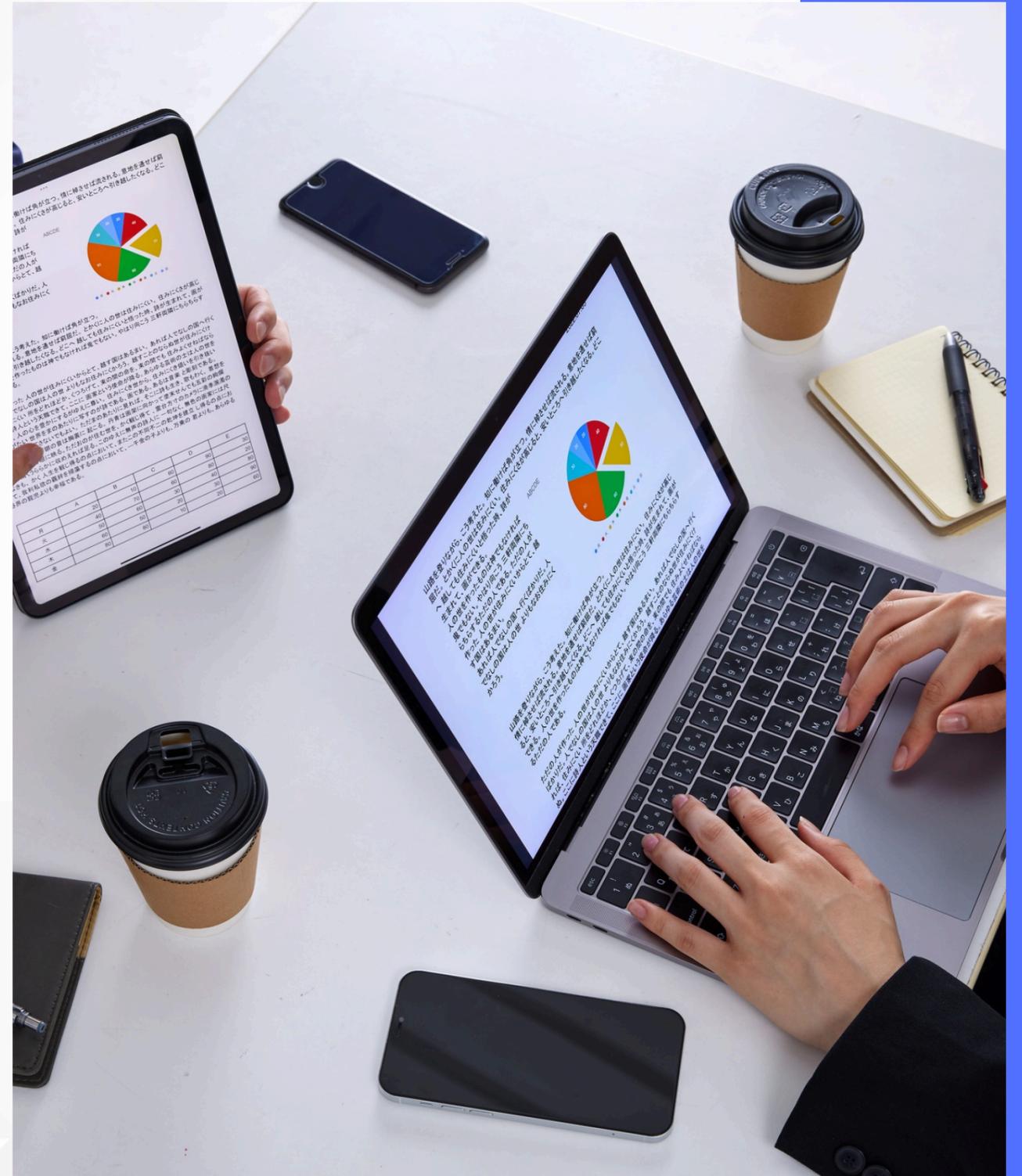


DRIVING INCLUSIVE PRACTICES

- Strengthens community commitment to barrier-free urban mobility, fostering shared responsibility and long-term engagement in accessibility initiatives





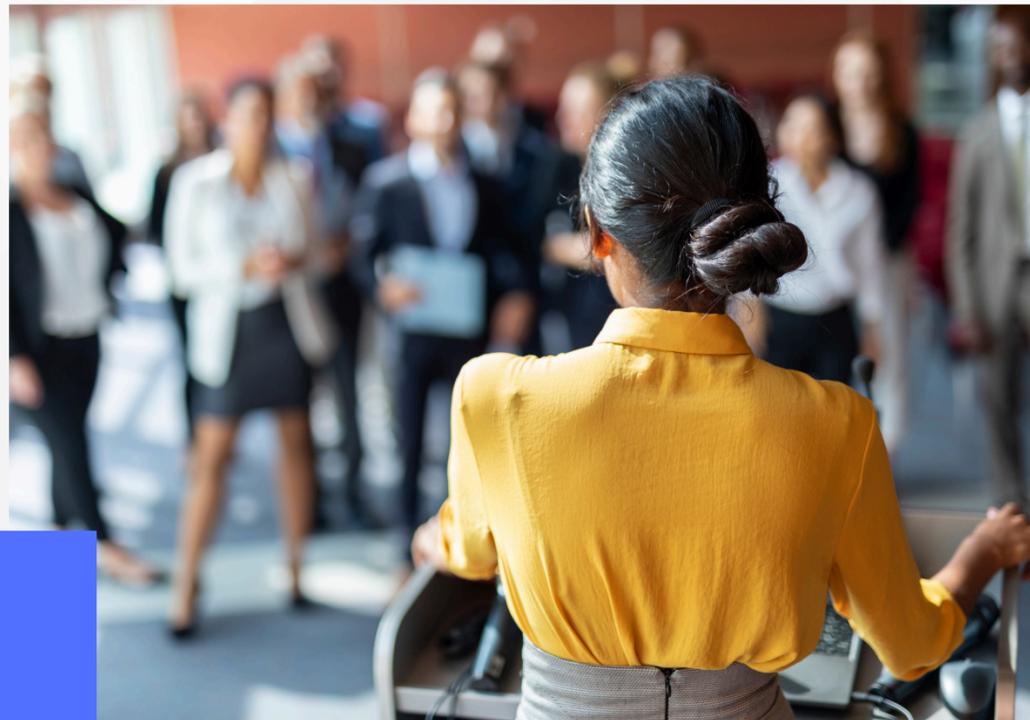
HANDS-ON COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS

BARRIERS TO EFFECTIVE DISSEMINATION

- Translating technical findings into accessible and actionable messages necessitates careful adaptation of complex information, ensuring that outcomes are understandable, applicable, and conducive to informed decision-making by varied audiences.

OVERCOMING CHALLENGES AND STRATEGIES

- The use of multimedia tools facilitates engaging and relatable content, enhancing comprehension and retention of key accessibility concepts among diverse audiences.
- Integrating in-person workshops with online campaigns allows for broader reach and more inclusive participation, ensuring that dissemination efforts are not limited by geographical or logistical constraints.
- Actively involving participants in communication and advocacy activities promotes co-creation, strengthens stakeholder engagement, and ensures that messages are grounded in authentic experiences, thereby increasing credibility and impact.



LESSONS LEARNED FROM DISSEMINATION

- Effective public engagement serves to enhance the scope and impact of project outcomes, facilitating the transmission of findings to diverse audiences and fostering active community participation.
- Integrating the authentic perspectives of participants enhances the credibility and validity of the project, as experiential insights provide evidence-based support for accessibility interventions.
- Employing a multi-channel dissemination strategy, including workshops, digital media, reports, and audiovisual materials, optimizes comprehension and encourages the uptake of inclusive practices, thereby promoting the sustainability and institutionalization of project results.

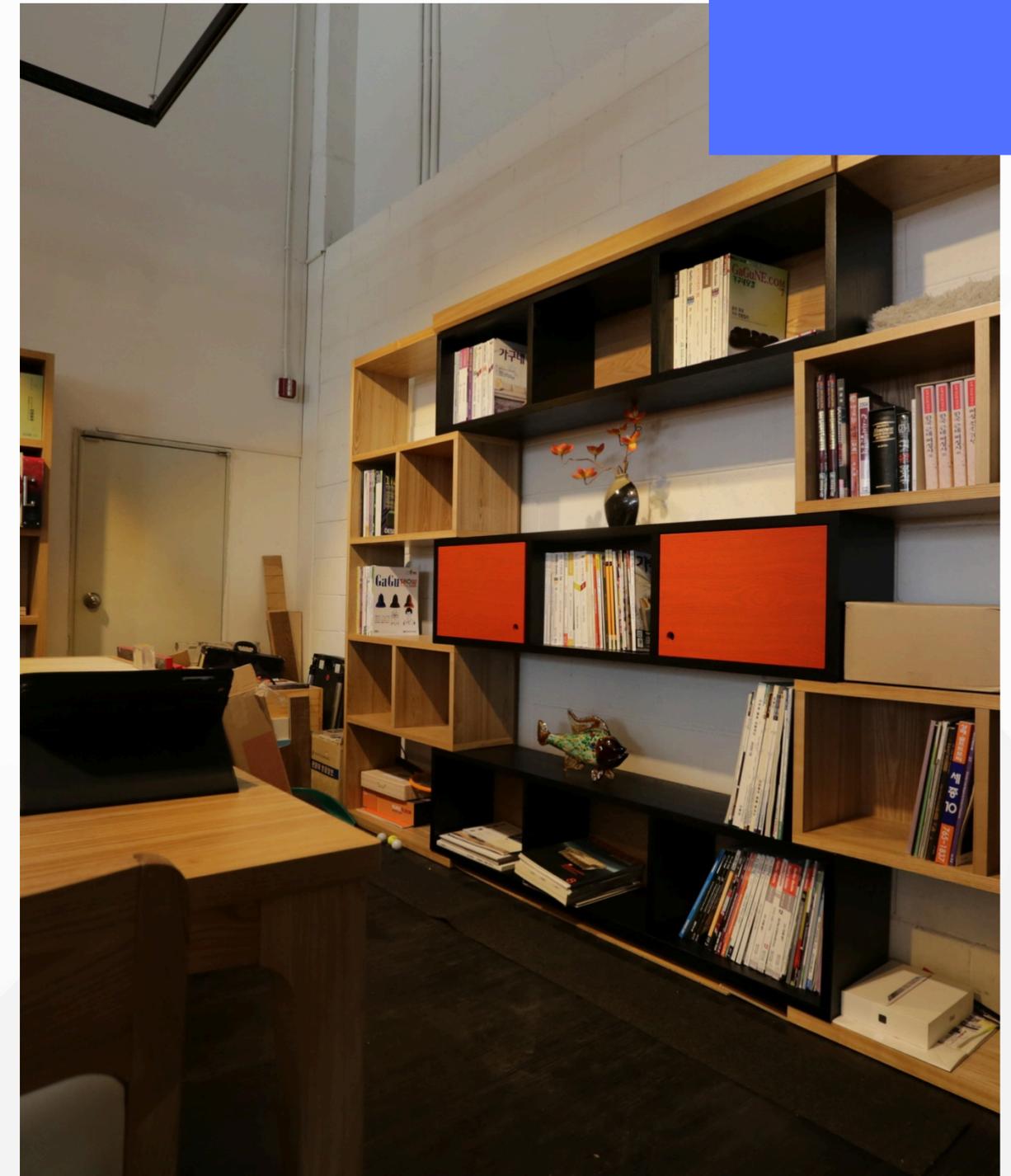
PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS AND COMMUNITY IMPACT
